FAQs about the development of Diamond Place

Who owns Diamond Place? The City Council and the University of Oxford (Ewert Place).

Does Diamond Place development include Ewert Place? Yes.

Are the University and the Council going to produce a joint plan? This is the intention but we cannot be certain.

Why is Diamond Place being redeveloped? The City Council wants to meet their additional housing demand and the University needs more post-graduate accommodation.

When is Diamond Place going to be redeveloped? The timescale is unclear but the City Council and the University are drawing up plans now and are keen to build the additional housing in the very near future. The Council has commissioned a development brief from Carter Jonas that will be published soon.

What is the Council's role in the redevelopment of Diamond Place?

The Council owns half of the site and is the planning authority that will determine what development will be approved.

What are Oxford University's plans?
The University has entered into a Joint
Venture with Legal & General, and say
they want to build student housing on
their land but the details are unclear at
this stage.

When might the new Health Centre be built at Diamond Place? This depends on the overall redevelopment programme and on the NHS Clinical Commissioning Group responsible for planning new health centres.

Will there be parking provided for a new Health Centre and the Community Centre? Yes, as part of the overall parking plan for the site.

What will happen to the North Oxford Association (NOA) Community Centre Building? The building will be replaced by a new community centre on Diamond Place. NOA have been assured by the Council that they will be located in a new purpose built community centre and that the new centre will be available for use before the old one is removed, leased on the same terms.

What is going to happen to the Ferry Leisure Centre? This will remain and may be upgraded.

Will the new Community Centre and the new Health Centre be in the same building? This is possible but it has not been decided. There are pros and cons in putting these together.

What type of housing for elderly will be provided? Housing for the elderly is not part of the Council's current plan but is one of the aims of the Neighbourhood Plan. Consultation on this element of the scheme is one of the reasons we need a Community Plan.

What role does the Neighbourhood Forum have in the redevelopment? We are an official consultee who will be formally consulted by the Council. We also want to ensure the community is fully consulted throughout the planning and development of the site.

What is the Diamond Place Working Group? It is a subcommittee of the Neighbourhood Forum and also has members co-opted from NOA.



What was proposed for Diamond Place in the Neighbourhood Plan?

The current plan includes:


- A new Health Centre
- A mix of housing of which 50% would be affordable (80% of which will be social rent), including some housing for the elderly
- A new Community Centre
- Green public open space
- Car parking for the centre of Summertown

The Council's Local Plan for Oxford 2020 and the Diamond Place Supplementary Development Document (SPD) 2015 drawn up by the Council contain many of these elements. The task now for the community is to ensure that all these are delivered as promised, and in a well-designed scheme.

Our Goal

Our aim is to constructively contribute to the development of Diamond Place by creating an image of what Diamond Place could look like based on the Neighbourhood Plan.


